CF Artist presents works at Watchung Art Center

WATCHUNG — Cranford Artist, Theodosia A. G. Tamborlane, is presenting two new, provocative oil paintings, "Ombrellos World" and "Corals Song", at the Watchung Art Centers fall show, "Artists Music".

As a musician uses the elements of rhythm, melody, harmony and color in the development and orchestration of a musical composition, so too, a visual artist uses these elements in the development of paintings and sculpture.

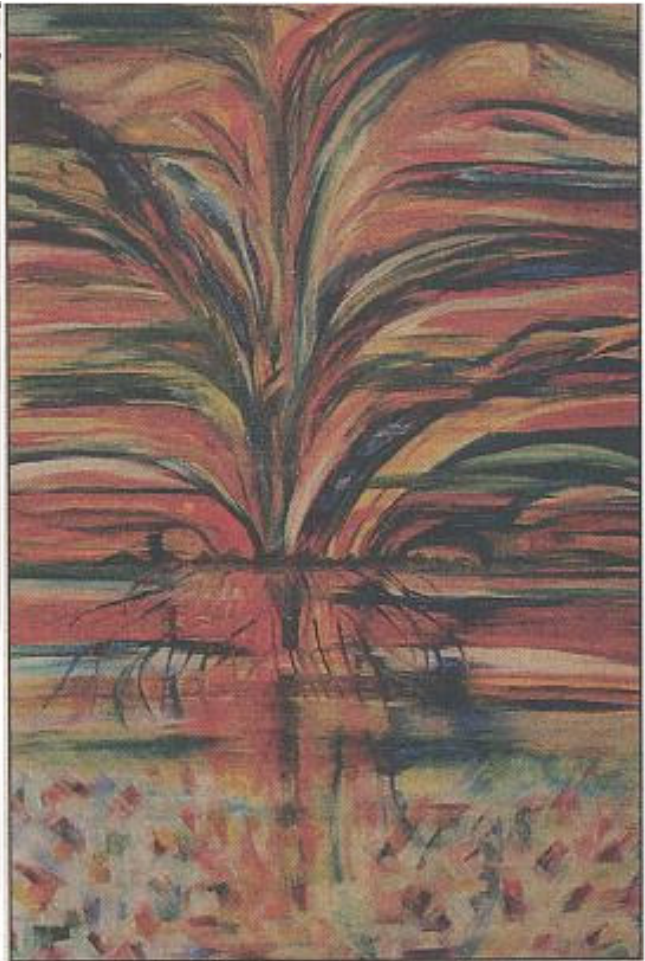
"Ombrellos World" was created by Tamborlane in tribute to Professor Thomas Ombrello, who teaches horticulture and other science courses at Union County College in Cranford. "Ombrellos World" depicts the range of geological stratifications that support above-ground trees, streams, deserts, oceans and mountains reaching toward the sky.

"Corals Song" takes the viewer under the seas of Key West, Florida, where Ms. Tamborlane resided before establishing her studio and her home in Cranford. Plants and images of animal life populate this dramatic three-foot sea landscape.

The Watchung Art Center is located on the traffic circle in Watchung. Opening reception for Artists Music is Sunday, September 7, from 1 to 4 p.m. The show is presented by the Contemporary Art Group, which has over 40 local-area artist members.

Tamborlane will also have a solo show of her paintings and three-dimensional collages at the Simply Gallery in Cranford in September.
